We invite you to consider joining us and presenting at the **South Carolina Association for Hazard Mitigation (SCAHM)** Conference. Our 27<sup>th</sup> annual gathering will be held **March 18-20, 2026** in **Greenville, South Carolina at the Hyatt Regency**. Proposals constituting sales pitches for products or services will not be considered.
